How to Pay for College

Don't let the cost of tuition stop you from getting the education you want and deserve! There is a *BIG* difference between the price tag on tuition and what *you* will actually pay. When financial aid, scholarships, and tuition discounts are applied, your out-of-pocket costs end up to be a *fraction* of total tuition! Almost *all* students pay for college with grants *and* low-interest loans from the government; loans must be paid back, but not until *after* you graduate (or withdraw). ACE students are *full-time* and can take full advantage of available financial aid. Work through the financial aid process with a counselor to understand what college will *actually* cost you, and then invest in yourself!

Degree Options

Our curriculum is practical and applicable to everyday life. The ACE Program offers three Associate's Degrees: Leadership Studies, Human Services, and Law and Justice. All majors begin with preparatory and general education courses, such as English, Math, and Social Sciences.

Leadership Studies provides graduates with the 21st century skill set necessary to be considered for and succeed in supervisory and management positions—skills like communications, critical and analytical thinking, team management, and decisionmaking. A Leadership degree equips you to determine and pursue your personal and professional life vision in any field.

Human Services students study sociology, psychology, intervention techniques, and perform field work preparing to directly assist populations in various facilities.

Law and Justice is for those interested in public law enforcement and social services work related to the criminal justice system or private security. Classes include introduction to law, police practices, and community and police relations.
