Human Services practitioners provide client services with a care team that may include nursing, psychology, physical therapy or social work professionals.


Locations of work are residential treatment facilities,



Human services workers help people improve their lives.
The term “human services” includes social work, psychology, case management, and child welfare.

Human Services Fieldwork and Courses

A major component to all Human Services education is learning by doing. The program therefore provides extensive field-based observations and experiences. Students also participate in several internships in a variety of community agencies and treatment facilities. Field work allows students to integrate and apply classroom social service theory under the supervision of qualified professionals.

- **Introduction to Human Services** reviews the history of the theory and practice of social welfare from ancient cultures to the contemporary United States and considers the economic and political determinants of social welfare systems.
- **Introduction to Case Management** examines the range of human needs and the resources made available to assist individuals and families in need. The function of social work in residential treatment, psychiatric, correctional, medical, aged and community services is described.
- **Intervention Skills and Strategies** teaches students how to engage a client, do assessments, develop a treatment plan, and choose appropriate interventions.
- **Geriatric Sociology** examines the impact of the over 60 age group on the family, the community, residence and health care options, the job market and a range of policy decisions.
