COURSE SEQUENCE

Early Childhood Education - Accelerated Off-Campus Program. *Completion of the courses listed below is required for an Associate's degree.*

Prior to placement in College level Math and English courses, students are required to complete a placement test to determine if the student is adequately prepared or if the student would benefit from college preparation courses. College preparation courses qualify for Financial Aid but do not count towards degree completion. Prior to enrolling in 200-level coursework in Education, all developmental course work in Reading and English must be completed, and students must meet professional development requirements.
